# WHAT TO EXPECT

## DAY OF MOVE-IN

---

**Review our packing list and make sure you know your move in dates, times, and location!**

- First Year student Move-in will take place on the morning of your orientation day: Saturday, August 19. More information regarding move-in will be shared with you by the Orientation Office.
- Transfer Students Move-in will take place on the morning of your orientation day: Saturday, August 19. More information regarding move-in times and locations will be shared with you by the Orientation Office.
- Returning student Move-in will take place on Sunday, August 20 from 8am to 6pm & Monday, August 21 from 8am to 4pm at your designated check-in location. More information will be shared via email leading up to your arrival.

## DURING MOVE-IN

- Students may bring guests to assist with move in.
- Head over to your assigned check in location to get signed in and pick up your key.
- Review driving and parking directions that will be sent via your email.
- Meet your Resident Advisor (RA)! Your RA is an upper-class student living in your area trained to work with other residents to establish a sense of community for all on-campus students. Your RA is a great resource who can help answer questions regarding FSC and surrounding communities. They can assist with roommate communication, maintenance concerns and other issues of interest. Throughout the year, RAs will plan various programs and activities with, and for, the residents. Also, an RA is on duty each night and during weekends.

# PREPARING FOR MOVE-IN DAY

## CONTACTING YOUR ROOMMATE(S) VIA EMAIL

We encourage you to contact your new roommate and suitemates. Contact information is available through the portal. Two main things you want to do in this initial conversation are to introduce yourself and to provide some information about your likes and dislikes.

This is also a great time to discuss and coordinate what items you will be bringing to campus. Some topics to get you started: Favorite music, food, movies or TV shows, your planned major or classes that you'll be taking at FSC, what each of you will bring; TV, computer, printer, fridge, microwave, etc. and ways to stay in touch over the summer.

- Prohibited Items include, but are not limited to: Bottle rockets and any fireworks Chemical bombs Firearms, rifles, bayonet, BB guns, stun guns, and tasers Switch blades, hunting/fishing knives, and recreational knives with blades longer than 4 inches Medieval weapons, slingshots, nunchucks, martial arts weapons, and bows & arrows Interior paint, paint cans, spray paint, and paint thinner Propane canisters, lighter fluid, gasoline, gasoline cans, charcoal, tiki-torches, and tiki-torch fuel
- Alcohol, chemicals, illegal substances, tobacco/vapors and drug paraphernalia

# LIVING ON CAMPUS

Here is a few important things to know about living on campus.

## PROGRAMMING

## HEALTH AND SAFETY

All members of the FSC Community Living—residents, staff and visitors are expected to act in a manner that demonstrates consideration for the health and safety of the community. RA staff will conduct health and safety inspections each semester to review the condition of the space.

## ROOMMATE AGREEMENT/RCR

Early in the semester, after a hall meeting with your RA, all roommates/suitemates will meet with their roommate and develop a Roommate Agreement. Your RA may help guide the conversation around communication and potential areas of conflict in your suite or apartment.

When you move in, a Room Condition Report (RCR) will be given to you by your RA. This report should be completed move in day. Please review this report and let your RA know of any concerns you see in the room that are not already listed on the report. This report will also be reviewed at move out as well.
