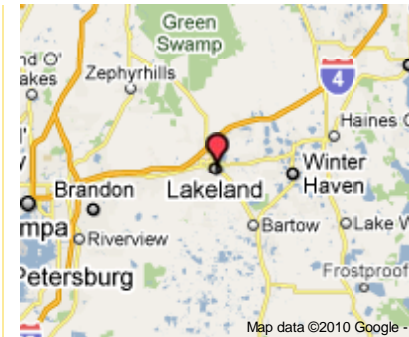

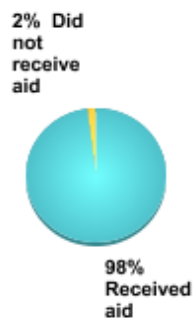

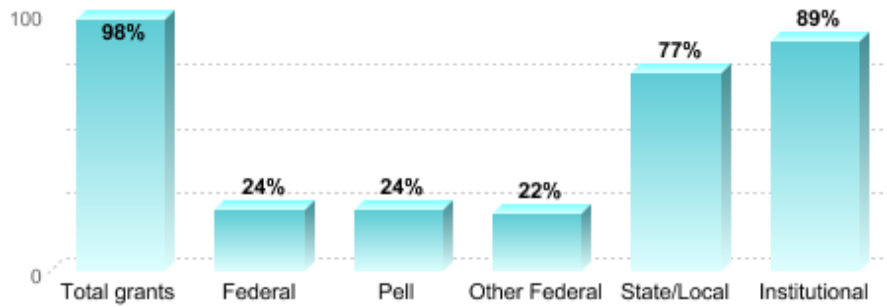
FULL-TIME, FIRST-TIME DEGREE/CERTIFICATE-SEEKING STUDENTS, 2007-2008

PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING ANY FINANCIAL AID

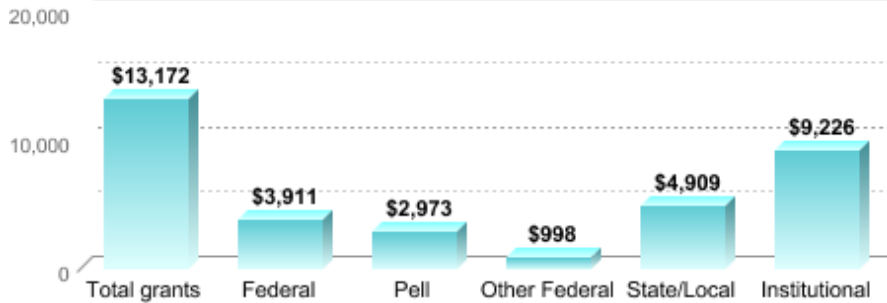


PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING GRANT AID BY TYPE

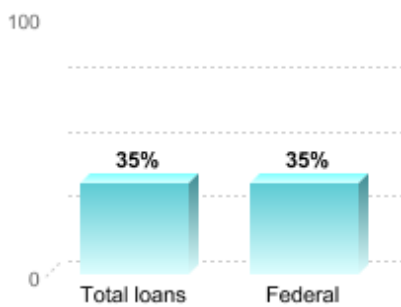
PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING GRANT AID BY TYPE



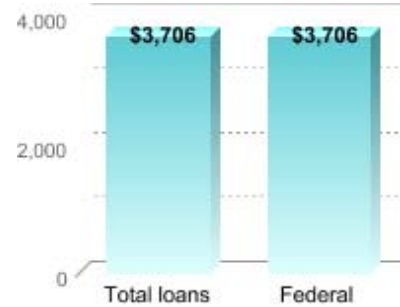
AVERAGE AMOUNT OF GRANT AID RECEIVED BY TYPE

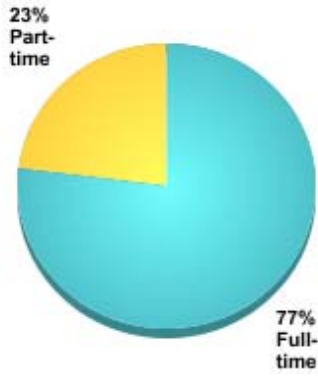

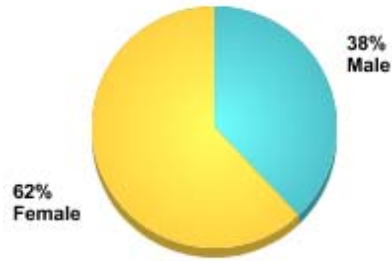
UNDERGRADUATE ATTENDANCE STATUS

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT GENDER

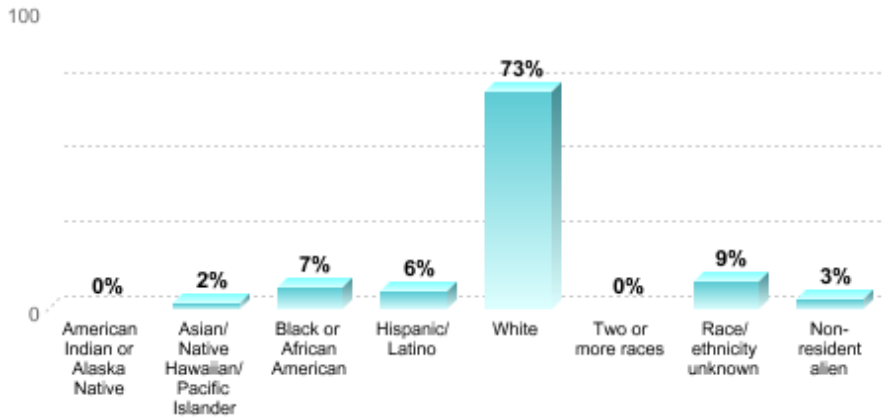
UNDERGRADUATE ATTENDANCE STATUS



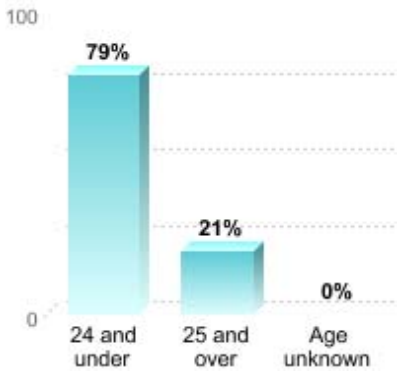
UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT GENDER



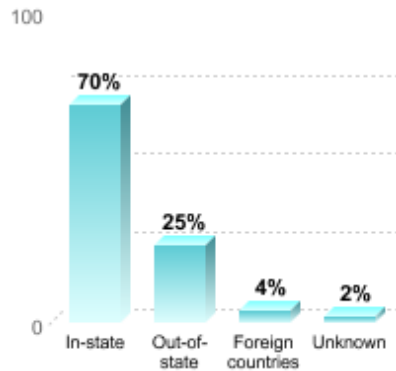
UNDERGRADUATE RACE/ETHNICITY

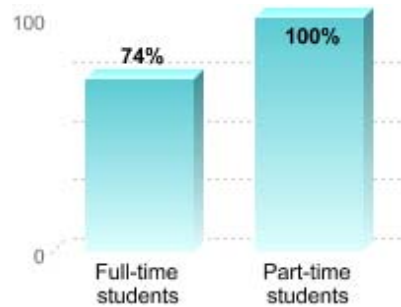
RETENTION AND GRADUATION RATES

Percentage of Students Who Began Their Studies in Fall 2007 and Returned in Fall 2008

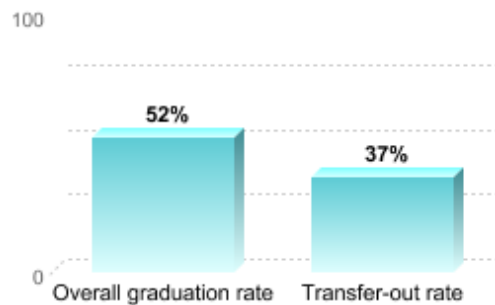
OVERALL GRADUATION RATE AND TRANSFER-OUT RATE

The overall graduation rate is also known as the "Student Right to Know" or IPEDS graduation rate. It tracks the progress of students who began their studies as **full-time, first-time degree- or certificate-seeking students** to see if they complete a degree or other award such as a certificate within 150% of "normal time" for completing the program in which they are enrolled.

Some institutions also report a transfer-out rate, which is the percentage of the full-time, first-time students who transferred to another institution.

Note that not all students at the institution are tracked for these rates. Students who have already attended another postsecondary institution, or who began their studies on a part-time basis, are not tracked for this rate. **At this institution, 72 percent of entering students were counted as "full-time, first-time" in 2008.**

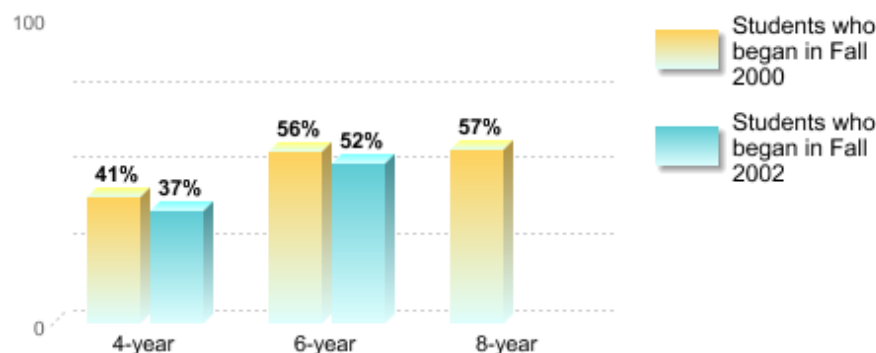


Percentage of Full-time, First-Time Students Who Graduated or Transferred Out Within 150% of "Normal Time" to Completion for Their Program

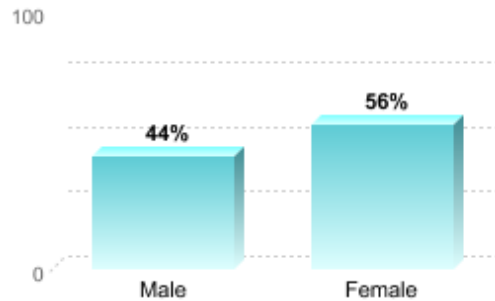
BACHELOR'S DEGREE GRADUATION RATES

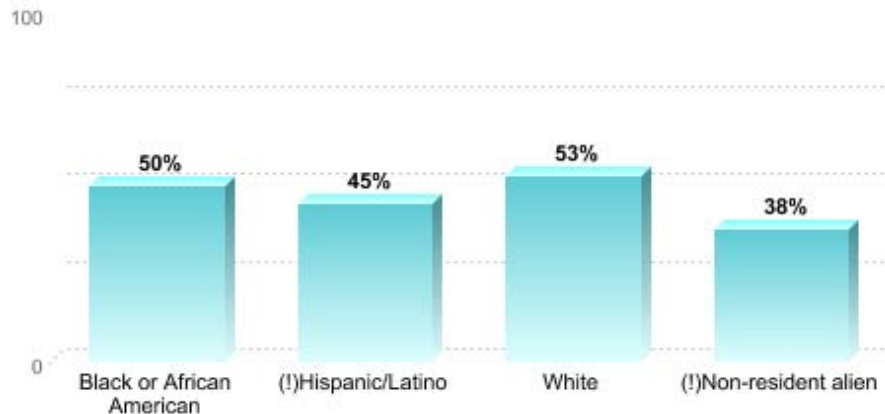
GRADUATION RATES FOR STUDENTS PURSUING BACHELOR'S DEGREES
