TRANSFORMATIONAL CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

The Master of Education in Transformational Curriculum and Instruction at Florida Southern College offers a 4+1 degree program for Education majors. This program is designed for individuals interested in earning a curriculum and instruction degree that advances classroom teaching skills through research-based strategies and techniques. This degree is focused on transformational teaching methods including active, student-centered, collaborative, experiential, and problem-based learning. These methods combined with the examination of how dynamic relationships between teachers, students, and a shared body of knowledge in the transformational teaching field will promote increased student performance, personal growth, and explore the positive impact that highly effective instructional leaders make on their students.

Early Admission (4+1 MEd)

Students are encouraged to apply for admission during their junior year. If admitted, seniors may enroll in one graduate course during their first semester and one graduate course during their second semester.

Convenient Schedule

- Scheduling is flexible and convenient for Florida Southern College Elementary Education seniors.
- Coursework is delivered 100% online.

Small Classes

Highly distinguished faculty are dedicated to supporting students in earning this degree. In addition to dedicated faculty, you will have small classes which will provide one-on-one attention and allow you to learn in an online format with your cohort.

Academic Advisor

Admission Requirements

- Completed online application (students are encouraged to apply for admission during their junior year)
- Must have 93+ credit hours completed at the start of the program
- GPA of a 3.0 or higher
- MEd in Transformational Curriculum and Instruction

Financial Aid

Undergraduate financial aid is available during enrollment prior to undergraduate graduation. After a student graduates with an undergraduate degree and receives Florida Professional Teaching Certificate, graduate financial aid will become available. Program Costs

Admitted undergraduate education majors will be allowed to complete a maximum of six credit hours of graduate work. These credits will count toward their MEd degree requirements. Any MEd courses attempted in the fall or spring semesters before receiving the undergraduate degree will be charged at the traditional undergraduate full-time tuition rate. Graduate courses taken after the student receives their undergraduate degree will be billed at the current MEd per credit hour rate.
