- ☐ Student information is restricted by FERPA. Make a plan with your student about how and when they will share academic information with you.
- ☐ Help your student prepare:
 - ☐ Make a plan in case of a medical emergency.
 - ☐ Provide a first aid kit to keep in their vehicle and/or residence.
 - ☐ Provide your student with copies of health insurance cards.
- ☐ If your student requires medication, plan to send a month's supply and begin the transfer process to a local Lakeland pharmacy.
- ☐ Encourage your student to check their FSC email regularly and begin taking ownership of deadlines.
- ☐ Talk about realistic sleep, nutrition, time management, and wellness habits.

THINGS TO DO

- ❑ Register for Family Weekend, October 2 - 4, by visiting flsouthern.edu/family-weekend
- ❑ October brings the new pressures of midterms. Encourage your student to get ahead and make appointments with professors to talk about expectations and assignments.
- ❑ Recommend your student has a conversation with their roommate to work out any problem areas before issues arise. Encourage your student to generate their own solutions to problems. If help is needed, your student should reach out to their Resident Advisor (RA).
- ❑ Ask how classes are actually going, not just whether they are “fine.”
- ❑ Ask whether your student has found one place on campus where they feel comfortable.
- ❑ Normalize the fact that the first few weeks can feel exciting and lonely at the same time.
- ❑ If your student needs a maintenance or tech issue addressed, remind them to submit a Work Request by visiting the FSC Single Sign-On web page.



CONVOCATION

Florida Southern’s monthly Convocation series is one of the meaningful ways students come together as a campus community to learn, reflect, and grow. These required gatherings give students the opportunity to hear from outstanding speakers, experience engaging programs, and explore ideas that may challenge, inspire, or broaden their understanding of the world.

Rooted in the liberal arts tradition and guided by the College’s vision, mission, and values, Convocation reflects Florida Southern’s belief that students benefit from encountering a wide range of perspectives and questions: intellectual, moral, aesthetic, religious, and civic. THINGS TO DO

- ❑ Help with move-out logistics but let your student manage checklists and deadlines.

MOCS CARE

Mocs Care is a Dean of Students emergency fund established to provide temporary financial assistance to Florida Southern students who experience an unforeseen circumstance that could jeopardize their ability to remain enrolled or continue their education. Examples may include unexpected medical expenses, emergency car repairs, or expenses resulting from a natural disaster. Funds are intended to address unexpected, short-term financial hardships and are not designed to cover routine expenses or supplement the general cost of a student’s education.

Parents and families can contribute to the fund through a \$35 donation, which includes a student-designed Mocs Care T-shirt, helping provide direct support to students experiencing financial hardship.
