


Your child isn't the only one going through the admissions process. As a parent, you're making sure to remind your student of important deadlines. You're researching colleges. You're thinking about costs and value.

A strong purpose makes all the difference.

EASING THE TRANSITION

Leaving home for college is a major milestone not just in a student's life, but also in the life of a whole family. How will the school make that transition seamless for your child and for you?

We believe information is key to a successful transition. So we start early, sending frequent communications that include customized checklists, personal reminders, and alerts about events that will help you and your student make connections on campus.

It always seemed so far in the future, but your student is almost through high school!

It's an exciting, yet anxious time for both of you.

Ensure a smooth transition to college life by using this timeline as a guide on what to do and when.

JUNIOR YEAR

Now's the time to address any areas that need improvement. Are grades and test scores where they should be? Has your child demonstrated a commitment to activities outside of the classroom?

Encourage your son or daughter to think about what he or she has accomplished and what they see for themselves in the future. Having a clear understanding will help answer some of the difficult questions that lie ahead.

RESEARCH COLLEGES

You can help your child review college websites, brochures, and guidebooks. Make a list of requirements and deadlines for each college your child is considering.

TEST

Make sure your student is signed up to take the PSAT in the fall and the SAT or ACT in the spring.



VISIT CAMPUS

The spring or summer of junior year is a good time to visit campuses and talk with admissions counselors. Be sure to document your experiences by taking pictures and notes — and ask plenty of questions.

FINISH STRONG

Colleges want to see a high school record with challenging courses and good grades — particularly in junior and senior years. Help your child select a rigorous but manageable course load.

SENIOR YEAR

The college preparation that takes place during your student's senior year is loaded with paperwork. You can best support your student by helping them keep track of important deadlines. You'll also play a key role in helping him or her to make that final decision.



APPLY!

Once your student decides on the lucky contenders, it's time to start completing forms and drafting essays. Students can apply easily using our online application or the Common App - and there's no application fee.



Remind your student to check his or her email for a link to our preferred application.

FILE THE FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opens on October 1. Complete it early to ensure you don't miss any deadlines.

RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS

Financial aid may seem complicated, but there is a lot of money out there to help families pay for college and many resources to help you navigate the process. It's work, but spending time searching for scholarships can pay off.

FINALIZE ENROLLMENT DETAILS

The following will require your attention:

- Completing the housing application
- Registering for advising/orientation
- Submitting placement scores, etc.

Encourage your student to tackle all this ASAP so there's no delay moving in or registering for classes.

PLAN TO ATTEND ORIENTATION

Sometime soon, that Saturday will arrive. Prepare yourself for the flood of emotion.

IDENTIFY THE MUST-

HAVES. After spending time on different campuses, you and your student will have a better sense of the options available. This will enable your child to decide what factors are most important.

TAKE NOTES. You're going to visit a lot of campuses, and before you know it, they will all end up as a blur. You and your child should write down your thoughts and impressions about a school — the good and the bad — as soon as the visit is complete.

VISIT. THEN VISIT

AGAIN. When you start visiting campuses early, you have the luxury of taking a second (or even third) look at a school. Consider a postadmission visit to make sure the school still feels like a good fit.

TAKE YOUR TIME.

Making sure a school is the right place for your child means spending time there. The Admissions office will arrange opportunities to tour campus, meet with a counselor, sit in on a class, and talk to faculty. Plus, all of these options show that your student is genuinely interested — and that is something schools are caring about more and more.

GO DEEPER. Take the tour, but then explore on your own. Once the official presentation is over, walk around campus and observe how students and faculty interact. Talk to students. Pick up a copy of the campus newspaper to see what concerns students have. All of this will give you different perspectives on the campus culture.
