Program Overview

Florida Southern College offers a Florida State Department of Education approved teacher preparation program in Elementary Education K-6. The program satisfies the educational requirements for the baccalaureate degree and initial teacher certification in Florida; including Elementary K-6, ESOL Endorsement, and Reading Endorsement upon completion.

Personalized Attention

With dedicated faculty members and small class sizes, you can focus on the lesson and freely express your thoughts and ideas with your peers.

Accelerated Program

Adult undergraduate programs are offered in flexible, 7-week terms that begin six times a year, allowing you to start your degree at your convenience. You can complete your degree at a pace that fits your lifestyle and take up to 12 classes per year (48 credit hours).

Academic Advisor

The moment you enroll, you'll be assigned an Academic Advisor to see you through your experience from start to finish. This advisor will help you develop an educational plan that matches your schedule and priorities.

Education students have a variety of opportunities to engage in field experiences both at off-campus partner schools and at FSC's own on site elementary and middle school, The Roberts Academy. Florida's only elementary school for children with dyslexia, The Roberts Academy, and its teacher education component, The Roberts Center for Learning and Literacy, offer enriching field experiences in the specialized Orton-Gillingham Multisensory Approach to teaching reading, writing, and spelling.

Financial Aid

Tuition deferment is available to students receiving employer reimbursement. FSC participates in all major Federal Aid programs including military funding, as well as State of Florida programs such as the Effective Access to Student Education (EASE) Grant and Bright Futures.

Admission Requirements

- Completed online application
- Provide official transcripts of all academic work taken previously at other colleges, universities, or professional schools.
- If fewer than 25 credit hours have been earned from a regionally accredited college or university, student should provide official high school transcript or GED scores, as well as ACT or SAT exam scores, OR as an alternative, applicants should instead submit an updated resume and elect to apply through the test-optional policy.
- Military service-connected, educational experiences may award transfer credits. Requests should be accompanied by documents describing the educational experience. (Seven semester hours of credit may be awarded.)
- Personal interview
- Complete an academic interest inventory at FSC
- If admitted, Polk County School Board background clearance
