Biographical Sketch

Rosario Santiago is a Florida Southern College alumna from Miami, Florida. The daughter of two Cuban immigrants, she was the first in her family to graduate from college. While at Florida Southern, she was part of Psi Chi (psychology honorary society), Alpha Mu Sigma (women's music honorary society), the Student Education Association, the Methodist Student Movement, and the Hall Council. She was also part of the Concert Choir, and in 1969, she was nominated to be Miss Southern by the Student Union Board. Rosario Santiago graduated from Florida Southern in 1969 with her Bachelor of Arts in Spanish and Psychology. Later, in 1979, she was named to "Outstanding Young Women of America" by the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of her 2019 reminiscences of her involvement in the 1969 Miss Southern contest. It includes the email of her memories, newsclippings, and a photograph saved and donated by the subject. Also included is correspondence between the subject and the Alumni Relations Department as well as the McKay Archives. This collection has been organized chronologically.
