

Full-ride scholarships are awarded to promising students to alleviate the stresses of having to finance their education — allowing them to focus on their studies. And Peter didn't waste a moment. Hollingsworth Scholarship

Full tuition and fees, room and board, books, and funds for travel

The Hollingsworth Scholars Program, *Florida Southern's Premier Scholarship opportunity*, awards a select number of the nation's top students. These competitive awards are available exclusively to students whose academic accomplishments demonstrate superior intellect, unwavering character, and robust ambition.

Funded through the generosity of Bernie Little, Jr., '90 and his wife, Mary Jane Hunt, the Hollingsworth Scholars Program was created to provide a dedicated student the opportunity to explore his or her leadership potential.

These coveted awards cover the full cost of tuition and fees, room, meals, and books for four years, and provide a travel stipend to underwrite the cost of an international travel-study experience. Awarded to first-year students and renewable each year, these scholarships are valued at more than \$200,000 over four years.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSIDERATION:

- 3.5 GPA
- Attained a 29 on the ACT or 1330 on the SAT

Application for this scholarship is by invitation only. A committee composed of distinguished faculty will interview each candidate, selecting students based on their academic promise, leadership potential, character, and future goals.

McClurg Scholarship

Full tuition and fees

C.V. McClurg was a well-respected member of the Lakeland community and president of the Peoples Savings Bank. After moving to Lakeland in 1923, he served as a city commissioner, circuit court judge, and mayor of Lakeland. In 1950, McClurg was named honorary chancellor of Florida Southern College.

The McClurg Scholarship was established in 1998 through a bequest from Leonora McClurg, C.V. McClurg's wife, and was one of the largest endowments the college had ever received. It was established to provide full tuition and fees for four years of study to academically talented students, regardless of financial need.

Recipients of McClurg have gone on to make their mark in a wide range of professions. The scholarship helped Christina Martin '09 pave the way to medical school at Loyola University in Chicago. Katie Luecht '14, a double major in psychology and interpersonal and organizational communications, serves as a user experience researcher at security leader Northrop Grumman. Exercise Science major Nicole Harrison '18 is now pursuing a Doctorate of Physical Therapy at the University of Massachusetts Lowell.



Dr. Marcene Christoverson Scholarship

Dr. Marcene Christoverson has an inspiring story of breaking through traditional roles and rising to the top of the business world. Not only does she have a 25,000-square-foot building named after her, but one of our most unique scholarships is also named after this influential leader.

A native of Boise, Idaho, Dr. Christoverson joined the U.S. Navy as a WAVE (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service) during World War II. She became a photo engraver following her discharge and then, through a Navy friend, got a job as a bookkeeper for a direct-mail firm, St. Johns Associates, Inc. in New York City. As time progressed, she climbed the company ladder and became chairman, president, and CEO of the company. Her company is recognized as a leader among women-owned businesses and received the "Bridges to Success Award" in 2000.

As an expression of Dr. Christoverson's belief that the nation's future is dependent on the effectiveness of higher education and its ability to prepare graduates, this scholarship is awarded to exemplary students in addition to any merit-based scholarships they may receive.

The Christoverson Scholarships are highly competitive awards that aim to offset the financial burdens of private education. These awards recognize students who are committed to making the most of their Florida Southern experience. Qualified students will be invited to apply, and finalists selected for a formal interview.

The priority application date is **November 15**, and applications are due no later than **January 3**.

George W. Jenkins Scholarship

Full tuition and fees, room and board, stipend, and funds for books and supplies

The George W. Jenkins Scholarships allow deserving students to complete a four-year college education without substantial economic hardship for themselves or their families. They are named for and funded by the founder of Publix Super Markets, Inc.

Designed to help academically outstanding students with financial need, these awards cover the total cost of tuition and fees, room, meals, books, and supplies for two semesters annually — up to four consecutive years — along with a \$4,100 annual stipend for personal expenses and a laptop computer. Awarded to first-year students and renewable each year, these scholarships are valued at more than \$200,000 over four years.

This scholarship is intended for students who submit evidence of exceptional academic achievement in a college preparatory curriculum, show school and community involvement, exhibit a strong work ethic, reflect leadership potential, and a desire to succeed.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSIDERATION:

- Be a resident of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, or Virginia
- Graduate from high school with a minimum GPA of 3,5
- Attain a 26 on the ACT or 1240 on the SAT (Please contact your Admissions Counselor if you wish to apply for this scholarship but have applied or are considering applying for admission under our Test-Optional Policy.)
- Have significant financial need as documented by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Present evidence of exceptional academic, community, and leadership achievement

Students who have overcome significant economic obstacles while achieving their academic and personal goals will receive special consideration. **Applications are due January 31.**

NEXT STEPS & DEADLINES

FSC accepts first-year applicants on a rolling basis. You will receive your acceptance letter approximately two weeks after your application is complete. After that, the steps to applying for a scholarship are easy!

- 1. Apply for admission and get accepted.
- 2. Apply for a scholarship. When you complete the Premier/ Prestige Scholarship application you will be considered for the Hollingsworth, McClurg, and Christoverson scholarships. Completed applications which include an essay, are due no later than January 3.

If you wish to apply for the Jenkins Scholarship, submit your completed application, FAFSA, records of community involvement, and two letters of recommendation. These materials must be received no later than January 31.

- **3. Schedule an interview.** Finalists will be notified shortly after the closing date and will be invited to schedule an interview with the scholarship selection committee.
- **4. Apply to the Honors Program.** A separate application is required for admission into FSC's Honors Program. The application includes an essay as well as a résumé detailing your experiences. Applications are due March 1.
- **5. Receive notification of your award.** Scholarship recipients will be notified in early April.

Which is Florida Southern's Premier Scholarship?

The Hollingsworth Scholarship is the College's most competitive award and covers the full cost of tuition and fees, room, meals, and books for four years. The scholarship also provides a travel stipend to underwrite the cost of an international travel-study experience.

What are Prestige Scholarships?

These scholarships consist of the McClurg and Christoverson. Students interviewing for these scholarships represent the top ten percent of the College's applicant pool. If selected for McClurg, we fully cover your tuition and fees. Christoverson Scholarship recipients receive an additional grant in addition to any merit-based scholarships earned.

What are the requirements for qualifying for these three?

Students must have a 3.5 GPA or higher in high school and a 29 ACT/1330 SAT score to be eligible to apply. Contact your Admissions Counselor if you wish to apply for these scholarships but have applied or are considering applying for admission under our Test-Optional Policy.

Are there separate applications for the Hollingsworth, McClurg, and Christoverson Scholarships?

No, there is one application for all three scholarships. The priority application date is **November 15**, and applications are due no later than **January 3**. Finalists will be invited to interview in early spring.

What is the Jenkins Scholarship?

The Jenkins Scholarship is a need-based merit scholarship and will cover the total cost of full tuition and fees, room, meals, books, and supplies for two semesters annually — up to four consecutive years — along with an annual stipend for personal expenses and a laptop computer. Applications for the Jenkins Scholarship are due no later than **January 31**. Finalists will be invited to interview in early spring.
