To verify that you provided correct information, the financial aid office will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. Complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid office. We may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact the financial aid office as soon as possible so that there will be no delays or suspension regarding your financial aid.

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## Section E TAX FILERS

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A 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcript may be obtained through:

- Get IRS Transcript Online <u>www.irs.gov</u>
  - 1. Click Get Your Tax Record & then Click Get Transcript Online.
  - 2. <u>Request the "Return Transcript"</u> and <u>NOT the "Account Transcript."</u>

Note - Get Transcript Online tool requires the following:

- A. Access to a valid email address.
- B. A text-enabled mobile phone (pay-as-you-go plans cannot be used) in the user's name, and
- C. Specific financial account numbers (such as a credit card number or an account number for a home mortgage or auto loan).
- D. The transcript will display online upon successful completion of the IRS's two-step authentication.
- **Get IRS Transcript by Mail** <u>www.irs.gov</u> Transcript receipt within 10 business days.
  - 1. Click Get Your Tax Record & then Click Get Transcript by Mail.
  - 2. <u>Request the "Return Transcript"</u> and <u>NOT the "Account Transcript."</u>
- Unable to get a Transcript If unable to get a copy of your transcript, you may submit a signed (wet signature) 2023 IRS tax return with all applicable schedules (1, 2, 3).

#### Section F FILING EXTENSION

Individuals granted an extension for 2023 beyond the automatic six-month extension, must provide:

- 1. A signed statement listing the sources of any 2023 income and the amount of income from each source;
- 2. A copy of the IRS's approval of an extension beyond the automatic six-month extension for tax year 2023;
- 3. A copy of IRS Form W–2 for each source of employment income received or an equivalent document for tax year 2023; and
- 4. If self-employed, a signed statement certifying the amount of the individual's Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) and the U.S. income tax paid for tax year 2023.

### Section G VICTIMS OF IRS TAX-RELATED INDENTITY THEFT

Victims of IRS tax-related identity theft must provide:

- 1. A signed 2023 income tax return and applicable schedules the individual filed with the IRS; and
- 2. A statement signed and dated by the tax filer indicating that he or she was a victim of IRS tax- related identity theft and that the IRS is aware of the tax-related identity theft.

### Section H AMENDED TAX RETURN

Individuals who filed an amended 2023 IRS income tax return must provide:

- 1. Signed copy of the 2023 IRS Form 1040X, "Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return," that was filed with the IRS or documentation from the IRS that includes the change(s) made by the IRS, in addition to one of the following:
  - a. Updated income and tax information from the IRS on an ISIR record with all tax information from the original tax return;
  - b. A 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcript that will only include information from the original tax return and does not have to be signed, or any other IRS tax transcript(s) that includes all of the income and tax information required to be verified; or
  - c. A signed copy of 2023 IRS Form 1040 and the applicable schedules 1, 2, 3 that were filed with the IRS.

# Section I FILED A NON IRS INCOME TAX RETURN

A tax filer who filed an income tax return with a tax authority other than the IRS may provide a signed copy of his or her income tax return that was filed with the relevant tax authority. However, if we question the accuracy of the information on the signed copy of the income tax return, the tax filer must provide us with a copy of the tax account information issued by the relevant tax authority before verification can be completed.
